“Often said to be Little Rock’s best example of a Colonial Revival cottage, the house is really too large to be called a cottage. However, in the typical Colonial Revival cottage style, the Vinson House has a steeply-pitched hipped roof with cross gables, and a wraparound porch with classical Ionic columns.”<sup>1</sup>
