“Little Rock’s Old Post Office and Courthouse—also known as the Old Post Office and Customs House or the Old Federal Building—was completed in 1881. Additions to the original building were constructed in 1897, 1908-1910, and 1997. It was listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 1973 for its Renaissance Revival-style architecture.”<sup>1</sup>
